

PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS AT RISK OF NOT GRADUATING FROM HIGH SCHOOL

The Rice Lake Area School District recognizes that some students are at risk of not graduating from high school. The District will establish procedures to identify these students and will also establish a written plan of intervention. This plan will include individualized program planning, the establishment of credit equivalency, program monitoring and evaluations as well as the integration of school, parent and community resources. This written plan of intervention is intended to prevent the premature exit from school of students having been identified as students at risk of not graduating from high school.

Students at risk means pupils in grades 5 to 12 who are at risk of not graduating from high school because they are drop-outs, or are 2 or more of the following:

1. One or more years behind their age group in the number of high school credits attained
2. Two or more years behind their age group in basic skill levels
3. Habitual truants
4. School Age Parent
5. Adjudicated delinquents
6. Eighth grade students who meet one of the following:
 - a. Students who score below the basic level in each subject area on the examination administered under S.118.30 (1m) (am)
 - b. Students who failed the examination administered under S.118.30 (1m) (am)
 - c. Students who failed to be promoted to the 9th grade
