

FULL-TIME STUDENTS

In order to be considered a full-time student in the Rice Lake Area School District, a student must attend a full day of school during the regular school hours on a daily basis as determined by the administration and approved by the Board of Education.

Following are exceptions to the above. Students attending school under these exceptions are considered full-time students because of the nature of the programs and the circumstances involved.

1. Students who are assigned less than a minimum class load by Individualized Education Program (IEP) Team decisions and with parent/guardian approval.
2. Students who are in a co-op or work experience program.
3. Students who are receiving homebound instruction as approved by parent/guardian and a licensed physician.
4. Students enrolled in any alternative education programs or participating in program or curricular modifications.
5. Students who have other exceptional needs and who are assigned a program determined by the administration with parent/guardian approval to be beneficial to the educational progress of the students.
6. Secondary level students who concurrently attend a District school and a local institution of higher learning.
7. Students participating in Rice Lake Area School District distance learning programs.
8. A resident student attending public school in another school district under the fulltime public school open enrollment law.

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
